The Candidate for Confirmation must complete the following requirements:

1. Follow the precepts of the church (CCC#2041-2043).
2. Attend Sunday Mass weekly.
3. Attend or make-up all mandatory Sacramental Class Sessions.
4. Attend or make-up all mandatory Religious Education classes for 7th and 8th grade.
5. Complete at least 16 hours of Community Service, with eight of those hours served in the Parish and eight outside the Parish.
6. Choose a Confirmation sponsor who is a practicing, confirmed Catholic over the age of 16.
7. Choose a patron saint name and know the history of that saint.
8. Attend or make-up mandatory Confirmation Retreat.
9. Write a letter to the Bishop indicating your readiness and desire to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.
10. Pass an examination and an interview showing your knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith.

Each candidate for Confirmation must compose a letter to Bishop Felipe Estevez. The following are guidelines and suggestions for the content of the letter. Your letters must comply with these mandatory formatting rules and will be returned if not: (a template is provided as well)

- All letters must be typed on one side of a plain sheet of paper.
- Please use appropriate paper (do not use paper ripped from a notebook, or scrap paper)
- Do not use any fancy or artistic type font
- Sign and date the letter

Addressing the Bishop

Address the envelope as follows: To the Most Reverend Felipe Estevez, Bishop of St. Augustine

Begin the letter with the date and salutation: Dear Bishop Estevez,

Suggestions for the content of the letter

Tell the Bishop something about yourself.

- Who are you? What do you like to do? Do you have any special interests or hobbies?
- What is different about you this year as compared to last year?
- How have you grown as a person?

Request the Sacrament of Confirmation for yourself.

Indicate that this is your decision and the sacrament is one that you want to receive.

Sponsors: Each candidate is to have a sponsor. It is the responsibility of the sponsor to assist the candidate in their faith journey and encourage the confirmed person to mature in Christian faith and witness. To be admitted to the role of sponsor a person must:

- have completed their 16th year
- be a Catholic who has been confirmed and admitted to the Eucharist as well as one who leads a life in harmony with the faith and the role undertaken as sponsor.
- not bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared;
- not be the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (code of canon law 874)

Sponsors unknown to the pastor are to provide written evidence from their parish that they fulfill these requirements. The rite suggests the sponsor of Baptism continue in this role at Confirmation. This presumes that the person still meets the requirements of canon 874.

“When the son of man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will set on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations and he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will place the sheep at his right hand, but the goats at the left. Then the King will say to those at his right hand, ‘Come, O blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me. Then the righteous will answer him, Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you? And the King will answer them, ***‘Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me’.***”

Then he will say to those at his left hand, ‘Depart from me, you cursed, in the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me. Then they also will answer, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to you?’ Then he will answer them, ***‘Truly, I say to you as you did it not to one of the least of these, you did it not to me’.*** And they will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.”

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Confirmation Dress Code

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**Candidates for Confirmation must be dressed in their
"Sunday-best" attire and follow these guidelines:**

For Young Men:

- Dress pants (*no jeans*)
- Dress coat (optional)
- Shirt
- Tie

For Young Women:

- A dress, or a skirt and blouse, or a pantsuit—*none of which may be tight-fitting*
- The dress or skirt must reach the knees (no mini-skirts) and cover the back.
- The dress or blouse must have sleeves that cover the shoulders. (*Spaghetti straps, etc. are not appropriate.*)
- No low-cut tops on blouses or dresses.
